


Year 3

Another busy week for year 3! In English, the children have been learning how to write instructions and had a go at following them to make their own jam sandwiches. Who knew that instructions had to be so precise? As well as being chefs, they have also become model makers, writing instructions on how to make their very own plasticine rabbits for The Curse of the Were-Rabbit! In maths, year 3 have been continuing to investigate addition methods. They are beginning to move away from adding mentally, and are exploring more formal written methods, such as column. Despite a whole day of topic last week, the children have still been busy learning even more about the Stone Age this week! They have had fun becoming real historians and considering all the changes that happened across the mesolithic and neolithic periods, moving into the Iron Age. They were quite surprised to learn that people were cleverer and more sophisticated than they had first thought!

The photos below show the year 4s enjoying one of our Friday maths challenge mornings. The domino challenge appears quite straightforward at first, however the task can become more complex and as well as the children "loving" their maths lesson, there were some valuable maths skills being used, not least, lots of trial and adjustment. In English, mouths have been watering as the children used their knowledge of persuasive writing to create an advertisement for a fantasy chocolate bar.. Superlatives, hyperboles and rhetorical questions were abound, this English writing certainly hit the spot. Food chains, who eats who, and using the correct scientific language were the key features of science lessons this week, and in topic the children completed leaflets about Mexico.



Middle School News

In DT, year 6 are learning about product design and making. They have designed a pair of wool felted slippers and are now creating the felt in line with their design. We have discussed the origin of fibres and considered the difference between man-made and natural fibres.

In Food Technology this week, as a treat, we have been making 'Rocky Road'. These delicious biscuits have certainly gone down well and although not the healthiest of snacks, have allowed the children to practise measuring ingredients accurately using scales.

In Science, year 5 have been investigating the link between heart rate and exercise. They performed Jumping Jacks for varying lengths of time and compared how much their heart rate changed throughout.

Year 6 had a visit to Kew Gardens to round up their unit on plant reproduction. They also made spinners explaining the stages of the plant life cycles.

In Geography, year 5 have had an exciting week as they have been working in teams to complete maps of the UK from memory, competing against each other to complete the most accurate maps. We have had some great maps created, and all from memory!

Year 6 have been tuning up their vocal chords this week. We have been exploring the route of a river from source to mouth and in order to practise some new, tricky, key words we have been singing! There is a fantastic song we are working on at the end of each lesson to help refine our use of keywords and having lots of fun along the way!

Charities in 2019

The autumn term is always a busy one for charitable events – with Harvest Festival, Remembrance Day, Children in Need and Christmas, this is inevitable but we do hope that we can guide you through it and allow you to make decisions about the events and charities that you wish to support. Macmillan coffee morning

We had a fantastic Macmillan day – with a coffee morning and cake sale. Thank you to Mrs Trup, Mrs Samuel-Napier and Dr Phillips, as well as all their helpers for arranging and managing everything. The event raised over £500 which is amazing.

Harvest Festival

Edge Grove families are renowned for being incredibly generous at Harvest Festival and this is a vital time for many charities. Once again this year we will be supporting the Watford and Three Rivers Refugee Partnership (WTRRP) and the Watford Food Bank. The WTRRP supports genuine asylum seekers who have entered this country seeking refuge. They can only receive £36.95 a week in the form of a subsistence allowance. For this reason they rely heavily on donations. Please do look at the WTRRP website which is hugely informative and gives some poignant stories of refugees in the area, some of whom staff at Edge Grove have met and heard speak at WTRRP AGMs.

This year they are in particular need of: **long life milk; fruit juice; rice; tinned tomatoes, meat, vegetables, fruit, sweetcorn & custard. They have plenty of baked beans and tinned pulses.** Please feel free to bring donations in as soon as you like.

Remembrance Day

FLOURISH CHALLENGE

BE ACTIVE

This year we will be focussing on the six different elements of wellbeing, one per half term. These are: be active, eat well feel well, give, connect, keep learning and take notice.

The aim is to get the children to look at different aspects of their own lives and make changes that will have a positive impact on their mental wellbeing. It is the intention that the staff will inspire the children to recognise how to do this.

For this half term, the focus is *be active*. I have delivered assemblies to all of the children to educate them as to ***why*** exercise makes us feel better – not just physically but mentally too. I have asked them all to think about how exercise makes them feel and how they can use exercise to improve their mental wellbeing.

As a part of this, I will be issuing challenges to the children in each of the three terms. They seemed very excited by these – and at the prospect of being able to beat the teachers! This term, during the month of October, a group of staff will be aiming to swim the equivalent of the English Channel – 21 miles. This will be done both in open water and local pools. I have asked all of the children to pledge how far they think that they will be able to swim during the month of October in order that, as a collective, they swim further than the staff. It doesn't matter if it is 10 meters or 1000m, with or without armbands, we just want the children to set themselves a challenge. There will not be merits or medals for this, the reward is a feeling of accomplishment and pride. After half term I will add up the total distances and present them back to the children.

In the spring term there will be a walking challenge and the summer will focus on cycling. More information to follow.
